GOAL OF THE COURSE:

Are you excited by what you've learned about the brain and behavior? Would you like to explore career opportunities related to teaching science, public outreach, and neuroscience? Are you interested in developing marketable skills, including public speaking, performance, and the ability to organize complex material in an accessible way? Would you like to work directly with undergraduates and graduate students from area institutions, including WSU-Vancouver, PSU, and OHSU? Do you want to get public school students as engaged by the brain, and science and discovery as you are?

This class is explicitly designed to get you out of the undergraduate classroom, and into the local community, along with other undergraduates and graduate students from Portland State University, Washington State University, Oregon Health & Science University, and the Pacific Northwest College of Art.

You will collaborate and prepare a three week course on the brain and behavior for middle schoolers, or high schoolers, in the Portland or Vancouver Public Schools, directly participate in introducing topics in neuroscience, and lead multiple classroom projects and activities...

ENROLLMENT: Limited to 30 participants (maximum) with background in neuroscience. Add form required. Students will choose (or be assigned to) one of FOUR collaborative groups, with three weeks of instruction: 1. Sabin (middle school students), 2. Jason Lee (also middle

school), 3. WSUV (high school students), 4. Boys & Girls Club $(1 - 8^{th})$ grade).

<u>GRADES</u>: Grades are based on your reliability, responsibility, maturity, and your level of participation in these collaborative efforts, including design and delivery of the elementary, middle and high school courses. Development of course lesson plans and direct interaction with K-12 students is required. Students who successfully meet requirements will receive a "Certificate of Public Service."

<u>COURSE PLANNING</u>: Students will work with students from OHSU, WSU-V, PSU, and the Pacific Northwest College of Art to develop a plan for each lesson offered during the elementary, middle or high school course, including core ideas to convey, along with instructional materials, and activities designed to get concepts across to students.

IN CLASS DELIVERY OF INSTRUCTION: Students will work with middle school students at Portland Public Schools, or with high school students on the WSU Vancouver campus, or with $1-8^{th}$ graders at the Boys & Girls Club, and help teach two hour long classes, Mondays – Thursdays, for three weeks. Students will deliver short, relevant lectures, and offer engagement, monitoring and support for related classroom activities (including art activities).

<u>INTEGRATION WITH CAPSTONE</u>: PSU students can **co-enroll** in "Story, Video and Civic Action" (http://capstone.unst.pdx.edu/courses/story-video-and-civic-action) and use this summer outreach effort as a qualifying project for that course.
